## Reading Group Guide for The Key to Everything by Valerie Fraser Luesse

(Spoiler alert—these questions assume you've already read the book)

- 1. Peyton Cabot's particular circumstances are extraordinary, but what elements of his experience do you think are universal to all young people transitioning to adulthood?
- 2. Who do you feel is the hero of this story—Peyton, his father, or his mother? Why?
- 3. Of all the people Peyton encounters on his bike ride down the Atlantic Coast, which is your favorite and why?
- 4. Do you think Finn is a good influence or a bad one? Why?
- 5. Which episode from Peyton's journey says the most about the kind of person he is becoming?
- 6. Do you think it's possible for a place to change a person forever? Has it ever happened to you?
- 7. What intrigues you most about a story—what the main character is doing or what they're thinking and feeling? Why?
- 8. Why do you think Peyton is so drawn to Lisa? Does it have anything to do with his family experience, or is it just a young man's attraction to a beautiful girl?
- 9. Besides your parents, do you have a relative who has influenced you as Aunt Gert influences Peyton and his mother? If so, in what ways?
- 10. Why do you think Peyton comes to believe that the Cabots—his own family—aren't a real family at all?
